2. ETHICS TRAINING INFORMATION

Upon the Town Council's discussion, the council agreed to check dates and times and places and to let Clerk-Lynn know if they will attend a 2-hour session or the webinar at Lexington. Clerk-Lynn will update everyone on the Webinar as she learns more about it.

1. Planning and Zoning UpdatesDean Coe

• Update on Quasi-Judicial Training Seminar Dean Coe stated that the Planning Board did not meet as scheduled on March 2nd due to the snow. The next Planning Board meeting will be April 6th. He thanked the Town Council for their support and said he really appreciated this Town Council because they back the Planning Board in every way. An example is the <u>Quasi-Judicial Training Session</u> which was held in February in Greensboro and attended by the entire Planning Board and the Clerk. It was very informative, Mr. Coe said, and each member learned a lot of new stuff. Now he wants to apply what we've learned at the next Planning meeting. And, he reminded everyone, the Planning Board meetings are open meetings and anyone is welcome to attend.

4. Building Committee UpdatesLynn Reece Lynn Reece gave a brief synopsis of the Town Hall building, stating that prequalified contractors are ready to present their bid, which would happen on April 8th at the Wallburg Fire Dept.

A future discussion item is the permanent town hall sign for out front of the building. The sign has to concur with the town's sign ordinance. This should be discussed at the next town council meeting.

5. **MPO -** Winston-SalemMayor Todd Mayor Todd attended the February MPO meeting and the discussion was mostly about the equity formula. He said \$10-million had been allotted for the Yadkin River bridge project and could be underway in the next four to five months.
