Said property is located on the south side of North NC Highway 109 directly south of the Wallburg Road intersection. Property is further known as 8655 North NC Highway 109. Rezoning is requested to change from that of RS, Low Intensity Residential District to that of RC, Rural Commercial Zoning District. There will be a planning board meeting, Thursday, April 24, 2025 for that board to review application. Mayor Pro-Tempore moved to set a public hearing date for May 13, 2025; it was seconded by Councilman Lynn Reece. The motion carried with a (4-0) vote.

- 2. Wall Home Update Councilwoman Cindy Johnson gave update from the home's curator that it was a great month at the Wall Home with 37 visitors. Four members of the Wall Family come for a tour. Their relative was a sister of Sam Wall (George Wall's father). Complimentary coffee was held March 22, 2025 and was a success that brought in 25 visitors for a tour. The two rooms upstairs are almost complete. Next complimentary coffee is April 12, 205, 9-11am.
- 3. Town Hall Park Councilman Steve Yokeley advised delays due to inspections but all approved now and back on track. Masons start block and brick on pickleball building this Thursday. Trusses are on-site and ready once block/brick completed. Electrical and plumbing scheduled in 2-3 weeks. Completion target is late spring.
- 4. MPO High Point Lynn Reece attended most recent meeting held. Nothing was spoken of in direct regards to the Town of Wallburg.
- 5. **MPO** Winston Salem Mayor Allen Todd and Manager Mark Swaim attended most recent meeting. Nothing directly regarding the Town of Wallburg.
- 6. Hwy 109 DOT Project Councilman Steve Yokeley updated there is a current delay in engineering and design issues. Right-of-Way acquisition are backed up to summer or fall of 2025. Adding curb and gutter to both sides, entire project (due to amount of water and slope). The project has increased from \$4.5 million to \$4.9 million since 2021. Town local match is 20% (\$980,000) already paid \$150,000. \$766,000 ARP funding designated to project. Town will be requesting supplemental funding from WSTPO (MPO).
- 7. Manager's Report/Mark Swaim Mr. Swaim reported that he and Mr. Mayor attended the most recent Davidson County EDC meeting, nothing directly pertaining to the town was discussed. There is some interest in the Gumtree Road property. He attended a meeting from the NC Leage of Municipalities dealing with liability risk management. Insurance is looking for a possible 18% increase. Please get any budget information or request in to the finance committee, there is an upcoming budget preparation meeting.
